

**NZULEZO STILT VILLAGE &
WILDLIFE WEEKEND TRIP**

WEEKEND OVERVIEW

Explore the diversity of Ghana's landscapes by spending time at a unique stilt village, walking through the dense rainforests in search of wildlife and staying at an eco camp right on the beach (where nesting turtles frequent!). Not only this, but you'll learn about Ghana's history and local traditions with many planned activities.

One of the main highlights is jumping onboard a local canoe as you head off through the mangroves towards Nzulezo Stilt Village – where en route you may see monkeys, crocodiles and even marine turtles. Rising out of Tandane Lake, you will walk along the boardwalks, stopping off at the community hall, church, shop and local bar. You will be able to spend time in the village, getting to know the 500 or so locals and see how they live.

Another major part of the weekend trip is to head into the dense Ankasa Rainforest. You will learn all about Ghana's only protected wildlife zone, which is home to varied fauna and flora as well as some exotic wildlife including elephants, leopards, chimpanzees and monkeys.

Each night will offer some exciting activities, based right on the beach at the eco camp where you will be staying.

During the sea turtle nesting season (October to May), you will be able to head off on a night beach patrol with a local guide in search of any nesting turtles coming ashore to nest. There is no experience that compares to seeing a large sea turtle right next to you!

You will also be able to learn to play the drums and dance like a local, with a traditional cultural session arranged to take place right on the beach around a bonfire.

On top of everything mentioned, you will also go

on a guided tour around Fort Apollonia to learn about the history of the fort as well as learn about local palm wine tapping – and maybe even try some yourself.

Our structured weekend trips will ensure you get the most out of your time and a member of our local team will accompany you throughout.

Each trip leaves on a Friday afternoon and returns on the Sunday evening. The cost to take part in the trip is just **£159 per person**.

The following are included within the weekend trip fee:

- Transport throughout the whole trip
- Accommodation
- 3 meals per day
- Entrance tickets
- Sea turtle patrol
- Drumming and dancing session

ITINERARY

DAY 1 – TRAVELLING TO BEYIN, FORT APOLLONIA & SEA TURTLES

After your volunteering placement ends for the day, you will board the bus or private car to start the journey west to Beyin – around 2 hours.

Just before we arrive at our accommodation, we will stop off at Fort Apollonia. You will learn all about the history of the fort with a quick-guided tour. Named by a Portuguese explorer, the fort was used as a main trade post for slaves and most recently was bombarded by a British gun ship in 1873.

Afterwards, we will make the short trip to our eco camp accommodation, right on Beyin Beach! The

rest of the afternoon is free for you to enjoy the beach and watch the sunset.

As darkness falls, you will make your way along the nearby beaches with a local guide in search of nesting sea turtles.

During the peak-nesting season (October to May), you may stumble across a large sea turtle coming ashore to lay her eggs. Believe us when we say this is an experience like no other!

DAY 2 – NZULEZO STILT VILLAGE, PALM WINE TAPPING & DRUMMING

After a delicious breakfast right on the beach, we will head North to Nzulezo Stilt Village – a UNESCO World Heritage site.

One of the major highlights of the stilt village is actually the journey to get there! You will drive down an unpaved road, walk along the board walk and then hop onboard a traditional canoe.

The village is part of the Amasuri Wetland and the hour or so canoe ride will see you pass through narrow, lush channels, open plains and finally the wide expanse of Amasuri Lake.

Be sure to keep your eyes open, as the rivers and lakes are teeming with wildlife, including crocodiles, sea turtles, fishes and also monkeys above!

The village consists of stilt-supported structures that seem to integrate seamlessly within the water dominated landscape.

There is one long pier called Main Street by the locals, with buildings constructed on either side. On one side of the street you will find the houses and on the other, many small shops and businesses.

As you head on a tour around the village, you will stop at the community hall, church, school and the pub.



You will get to learn all about how the 500 or so locals live here, as well as have plenty of time to enjoy a unique shopping trip or drink with the locals.

After a fascinating couple of hours, you will start making the way back to the beachside accommodation. En route, we will stop off at a traditional palm wine tapping shop, where you will get to learn all about this local tradition and it's history.

The process involves sap being extracted from the cut flower of the palm tree, which then starts fermenting immediately due to the natural yeasts in the air. After just a couple of hours, an aromatic wine of up to 4% alcohol content is produced.

The action packed day is not over just yet! After an hour or two relaxing back on the beach at the accommodation and as the sun starts to set, we will have a traditional drumming and dancing cultural session.

Everyone will gather around the bonfire to enjoy the atmosphere and if you're feeling brave enough, even have a go yourself – the perfect way to end the day.

DAY 3 – ANKASA RAINFOREST

Today we will see another side to Ghana, some tropical rainforests! Ankasa Rainforest is found in south-western Ghana close to the border of Ivory Coast. The park occupies an estimated 509sq km of tropical rain forests, savannah grasslands and woodlands.

The extensive network of smaller streams and rivers supports a variety of plants, trees and several species of wildlife living in the riparian forests.

As you head on a guided walk around the rainforest, you will get to see some of the

800 species of plant and if lucky some of the rare species of mammal that call the forest home. These include Forest Elephants, Bongos, West African chimpanzees, monkeys, crocodiles, 200 bird species and even leopards – lets hope your luck is in!

Depending on the route taken while there, you may get to enjoy seeing the bamboo cathedral, waterfalls and rapids and the Tieghemella tree – one of the tallest trees in West Africa.

After an exciting (and hot!) few hours in the rainforest, we will start our journey back to Busua – just in time for dinner.

ACCOMMODATION

Throughout the weekend trip you will be staying right on Beyin Beach, where you can wake up to the waves crashing down in front of your feet.

The accommodation is called Eco Camp Beyin, which offers a truly unique experience. You will be staying in a bamboo built hut, which although very basic, will provide you with amazing surroundings!

You will get to enjoy your time with other tourists, locals and volunteers on the beach, as everyone comes together each night to talk and party around the bonfire.

MEALS

You will be provided with three meals a day that will consist of many continental and local items such as omelettes, burgers and fish. Meals will be served at local restaurants or at the hotel you are staying at.

TRANSPORT

Where possible, transport will be provided by private car or minibus. There may also be times



when taxis and public coaches are utilised. One of our local team members will accompany you throughout the trip.

If you want to take part on this amazing trip and the dates fall on your last weekend in Ghana, then you can still take part! Please arrange your return flight from Ghana for the evening on Sunday or Monday to ensure you have sufficient time to get to the airport.
